ACCESS:

If you have limited mobility you may buy designated seats online or by calling 802-760-4634. Box office windows, restrooms, water fountains, dressing rooms and the stage are also fully accessible.



SERVICE ANIMALS:

If you or someone in your party will be attending an event with a service animal, please let the Box Office know when you are purchasing your tickets so that we may arrange for an aisle seat.



ASSISTIVE LISTENING DEVICES:

Headsets may be checked out from

the Box Office in the lobby.

USE OF STROBE LIGHTS AND FOG MACHINES:

A notice will be placed at the theater entrance if either of these devices will be used for today's performance. If this creates a medical concern, please visit our Box Office.

HEALTH AND SAFETY:

Spruce Peak Arts is committed to the health and safety of all our patrons, staff, and volunteers. Hand sanitizer is available as you enter the building. Masks are not required.

IN CONSIDERATION OF OTHERS:

Please help us create exquisite experiences for others too!

ARRIVE EARLY:

We want you to enjoy a relaxed evening at the theater, so we recommend guests arrive at least 15-20 minutes before curtain time. The lobby of the Arts Center is open at least one hour before show time, and the doors to the theater open for seating one half hour before show time.

LATE ARRIVALS:

We know you try your best to arrive on time but we all respect the performers and guests who are already engaged in the event. Please allow the Ushers to seat you in the auditorium at an appropriate break—it's an intimate venue and everyone will see and hear you when you enter.

RE-ENTERING:

If you leave the building please take your ticket stub. If you must leave and reenter the theater, please observe the "Late Arrivals" rules.

SMOKING:

Vermont law prohibits the smoking or vaping of tobacco products in all the common areas of indoor "places of public access." Please smoke only outside the Arts Center in designated areas.

CAMERAS, VIDEOTAPING & FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY:

Please use a camera only as permitted by the artist, and no flash photography.

ELECTRONICS AND MOBILE DEVICES:

We ask that you turn off all devices or place them on silent so not to distract others enjoying the event and the performers on the stage.

BLOCKING AISLES: Fire safety codes prohibit standing or sitting in the aisles.

with your purchase is up to date. We have several options if a performance is cancelled.

Student Tickets:




Before the performance begins, please note the location of your nearest exits.
